Rules of Exhibit

April 30 - June 8, 2010

The National Arts Program Background

The National Arts Program (NAP) was conceived by Mr. Leonard Andrews in 1985 in Philadelphia. The program offers employees and their families the opportunity to exhibit their artistic talent in a public exhibit and have their work professionally judged. The event is highlighted by an awards ceremony where cash prizes are awarded and each participant receives a Certificate of Participation.

Eligibility

Participants must be a badged, full-time or part-time airport employee, or a family member of a badged airport employee. All entries submitted must be **ORIGINAL** work by the individual.

Entries **NOT ACCEPTED** are copies, kits, photographs of artwork, magazines or book illustrations.

Liability

Every attempt will be made to preserve, secure and protect each entry submitted; but neither the National Arts Program or the Greater Orlando Aviation Authority can be held responsible for damage or loss of art entries. The placing of art in the exhibition constitutes an agreement on the part of the entrant with conditions set forth. The National Arts Program Foundation, the National Arts Program, and the Greater Orlando Aviation Authority reserve the right to publish for publicity purposes reproductions of the entries. The National Arts Program and "Share the Art" is a public exhibit and photographing and filming of the exhibit is encouraged.

Classifications

Artwork will be judged in the classification of the artist's selection; however, the exhibition judge will make the final determination in some cases.

Adult

Amateur - person with little or no experience

Intermediate - a person with some experience and some art training

Professional - a person with serious art training or employed in an art related job

Youth & Teen

Youth to 12 years old

Teen 13-18 years old

Medium Categories

Craft (stained glass, weaving, etc.)

Mixed Media

Painting (oils, acrylics, etc.)

Photography (black-and-white, color)

Sculpture

Works on Paper

(pencil, ink, marker, pastel, watercolor, charcoal, etc.)

The National Arts Program and the Greater Orlando Aviation Authority reserve the right to disqualify entries they consider to be inappropriate for a public exhibit.

Rules of Exhibit - continued

Step 1

Registration Deadline

A Registration Form must be received no later than Friday, April 16, 2010. Maximum of **2 pieces per family**.

Registration Forms may be obtained by visiting the Orlando International Airport website @ www.orlandoairports.net, or by contacting Vera Walker, Art Exhibit coordinator at 407.825.3399.

Completed forms may be faxed to 407.825.3100 or dropped off to GOAA Executive Office Reception Desk, Main Terminal "A" side, adjacent to Security Checkpoint for gates 60-129.

Step 2

Preparing Entries

Submit only entries which fit into the listed medium categories. Two (2) pieces per airport employee family. All artwork must be mounted or matted with an identification (ID) label placed on the back.

Step 3

Delivering Entries

All entries must be delivered to the ITS Station "ARTport Gallery," 3rd Level "B" side adjacent to the Security Checkpoint for gates 60-129 on Thursday, April 22, or Friday, April 23, 2010 between 9:00 am and 4:00 pm.

No late entries will be accepted.

Step 4

Pick up of Artwork

All entries must be picked up at the ITS Station "ARTport Gallery," 3rd Level "B" side adjacent to the Security Checkpoint for gates 60-129 on Wednesday, June 9, or Thursday, June 10, 2010 between 9:00 am and 4:00 pm.
